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BayCare Announces New CEO

CLEARWATER, Fla. (August 5, 2022) **Stephanie D. Conners**, an experienced health care leader who began her career as a nurse, has been named the next chief executive officer and president of BayCare Health System, West Central Florida's largest not-for-profit health care provider and one of its largest employers.



Conners, 50, was selected by the BayCare Board of Trustees following an extensive national search that began in February after Tommy Inzina, BayCare's current CEO and president, announced his plans to retire by year's end. Conners will be the 25-year-old organization's fourth CEO.

Currently, the executive vice president and chief operating officer for Jefferson Health, a large, not-for-profit health care system based in Philadelphia, Conners will join BayCare in October to begin the leadership transition.

"For the board, it was paramount that we find a leader who is committed to BayCare's legacy of mission-driven, community-focused health care," said Rick Colón, chairman of the board. "In Stephanie Conners, we see an engaging and compassionate leader who will lead BayCare into its next era of serving the community's health, our team members and our medical community."

Conners will oversee a nationally recognized health system with nearly \$5 billion in annual revenue, more than 27,700 team members, and relationships with more than 5,800 local community physicians and other providers. Its primary footprint is Hillsborough, Pinellas, Polk and Pasco counties and includes 15 hospitals; a robust ambulatory division; one of the region's largest physician groups, BayCare Medical Group; and one of the state's largest home health services, BayCare HomeCare. BayCare is also the region's largest provider of pediatric and behavioral health services and operates

one of the region's few 5-star-rated Medicare Advantage plans, BayCarePlus®.

"I am humbled and honored to lead such a remarkable organization," Conners said. "Its legacy of compassionate care is palpable, and I look forward to helping ensure its future success. It is my personal mission to make a difference in the lives of others."

Conners, a native of Philadelphia, will have a lot in common with many BayCare team members, as she started her career as a bedside nurse before becoming a trauma nurse and then moving into management and eventually hospital operational leadership. She has spent nearly three decades in health care with both notfor-profit and for-profit providers, building a reputation as an inspirational leader and collaborator in driving the highest safety, service and quality of health care delivery while maintaining fiscal responsibility.

In 2002, Conners accepted her first senior executive role with Tenet Healthcare as chief nursing officer for Hahnemann University Hospital in Philadelphia, a position she held for a decade. She then went on to serve as senior vice president for operations and system chief nursing officer for Robert Wood Johnson University and Bristol-Myers Squibb Children's hospitals in New Jersey, and later, as chief operating officer and chief nursing officer for Cooper University Health Care, a not-for-profit system based in New Jersey. In 2018, she joined Jefferson Health as its chief operating officer.

Conners holds a bachelor's degree from Villanova University and an MBA from Eastern University. She and her husband, Timothy Conners, have four children ranging in age from 13 to 26, and one grandchild.

Conners will become BayCare's leader shortly before it opens its 16th hospital in Wesley Chapel in 2023 and as it finalizes decisions on a 17th hospital for north Manatee County, announced just last month. This expansion comes as BayCare continues to be recognized nationally for clinical outcomes, patient experience and efficiency metrics. In 2022, BayCare is among the top 20 percent of large health systems in the U.S., according to FORTUNE/ Merative™, which also ranked BayCare's St. Joseph's Hospitals among the nation's Top 100 Hospitals®.

BayCare was founded on July 1, 1997, by a group of local hospitals committed to ensuring not-for-profit health care continued to serve the region's health care needs. That commitment remains strong, with BayCare returning roughly 10 percent (\$497 million in 2021) of its annual revenue back to the community in the form of direct charity care, patient financial assistance and community programming.



WHY DOES PREGNANCY CAUSE VEIN PROBLEMS?

Pregnancy causes significant changes in your body, and these can adversely affect your legs. The fluid in your body increases by as much as 50% during early pregnancy, and you retain more sodium from the salt you eat. These two factors can cause edema resulting in swollen legs and ankles. Levels of hormones like relaxin, estrogen, and progesterone change dramatically during pregnancy, causing your veins to dilate and weakening the vein walls. At the same time, your growing baby is compressing the veins in your pelvis, increasing pressure in the veins of your legs, and resisting the outflow of blood from the legs.





These factors make pregnancy a tough time for your legs. Although the causes of vein problems reduce after you give birth, the effects of pregnancy can leave you with lasting issues.

WHAT POST-PREGNANCY VEIN **PROBLEMS MIGHT I HAVE?**

Common post-pregnancy vein problems are:

Varicose veins

Varicose veins develop because of the pressure and dilation of your veins and resistance to the outflow of blood from your legs. The result can be spider veins with underlying varicose veins even if they aren't visible. Most often there are visible rope-like, bulging varicose veins which may be tender or itchy.

Vulvar varicosities

Vulvar varicosities are varicose veins that affect your vulva. There are rare during pregnancy, and usually disappear over the months following delivery. If you have vulvar varicosities that don't clear up, Vascular Vein Centers provides effective treatments. Pregnancy and post-pregnancy for up to 3 months is a time when you are at greater risk of developing deep vein thrombosis (DVT). DVT risk is higher during pregnancy and peaks after giving birth. Your body is dealing with high hormone and fluid levels and an enlarged uterus, as well as a more sedentary lifestyle.

HOW ARE POST-PREGNANCY VEIN CONDITIONS TREATED?

If you have vein problems after giving birth or persisting swelling, it's advisable to seek an evaluation at Vascular Vein Centers. Hormonal changes continue to affect your veins and fluid volume for some months after having your baby and when you're breastfeeding. This is a good time to wear compression and begin exercising. You might find that once the hormones and fluid volume return to normal, the problem veins get smaller, but they don't go away and will become worse with time. Vascular Vein Centers provides advanced treatments for varicose veins, spider veins and vulvar varicosities, including:

- Foam sclerotherapy using Varithena®; an FDA approved treatment
- Endovenous laser therapy (EVLT)
- Ultrasound-guided sclerotherapy
- Cosmetic sclerotherapy for spider veins

These treatments seal off and eliminate affected veins, so your body directs your blood through healthy veins. The treated veins disappear over time. The procedures are all minimally invasive outpatient procedures that the Vascular Vein Centers team performs in-office. At Excel Pain and Spine, their team are experts at performing radiofrequency ablation. This minimally invasive treatment can get rid of your pain for months, years, or even forever.

What is radiofrequency ablation?

Radiofrequency ablation is a treatment that uses electromagnetic waves to create heat. The heat destroys the nerve tissue that's causing your pain. With the nerve destroyed, the pain signal is no longer sent.

What conditions are treated by radiofrequency ablation?

Excel Pain and Spine uses radiofrequency ablation to help patients with chronic pain in the lower back, neck, and sacroiliac joints, which are located in the pelvis. Patients with joint pain related to arthritis may also benefit.

It's also possible to treat other pain conditions with radiofrequency ablation. The team at Spine & Pain Institute of Florida will give you a thorough evaluation to determine the best course of treatment for your symptoms.

How does radiofrequency ablation work?

Radiofrequency ablation is minimally invasive, and the procedure typically takes less than an hour. It's performed on an outpatient basis, and patients are usually allowed to go home after a short recovery period.

Typically, you are given a local anesthetic at the treatment site. Then, using a special X-ray, Dr. Jassal inserts a needle near the nerve that's causing your pain.


Once the needle is in place, a radiofrequency current is passed through the needle to create a precise burn on the nerve. This destroys the part of the nerve responsible for transmitting pain and disrupts the signal to the brain.


Excel Pain and Spine will provide you with specific postprocedure instructions, and these usually include avoiding driving for 24 hours as well as resting and avoiding strenuous activity for 24 hours.

Is radiofrequency ablation effective?

Yes. More than 70% of patients experience lasting relief with radiofrequency ablation. It usually takes 1-3 weeks for the treatment to take its full effect.

Pain relief typically lasts 6 months to 2 years, and for some patients, the pain never returns. It's possible, however, for the nerve to regrow. In these cases, radiofrequency ablation may be required again.





Are there any risks associated with radiofrequency ablation?

Radiofrequency ablation is a safe procedure with few risks of complications. Serious complications, such as infection and bleeding, are rare. Temporary side effects – which are also uncommon – usually only last 2-3 days.

They include:

- Localized numbness or weakness
- Mild discomfort or an increase in pain
- Swelling or bruising at the incision site

The treatment is not a good option for women who are or may become pregnant, people with an infection, or those who suffer from bleeding disorders.



BUT WHAT I ALSO SEE ARE SMILES EACH TIME I DELIVER THE GOOD NEWS TO A PATIENT THAT THERE'S SOMETHING THAT CAN BE DONE ABOUT IT, ESPECIALLY WHEN THEY SEE THEIR RESULTS IN THE MIRROR.

September is Alopecia Areata Awareness Month, so I'm taking this opportunity to tell you a little about the most common forms of alopecia and why there are good reasons to relax and cheer up.

Recently, actress Jada Pinkett-Smith claimed she has alopecia on social media. You'll probably recall that her bald head was the inspiration for a joke told by 2022 Academy Awards host Chris Rock, prompting her husband, Will Smith, to go onstage and slap him.

"Alopecia" is the general medical term physicians use to describe hair loss from many different causes. all of which, fortunately, we can help with here at Bauman Medical. Perhaps you'll recognize what you're experiencing in one of these descriptions.

ALOPECIA AREATA (AA)

Alopecia areata occurs when your immune system mistakenly attacks hair follicles, causing inflammation that halts hair growth suddenly. Hair typically falls out in small, round patches on the scalp about the size of a quarter, thus its common name, "patchy alopecia areata." Actress Viola Davis (How to Get Away with Murder) says she's been dealing with AA since the age of 28.

Alopecia areata typically begins with the sudden loss of hair on the scalp, but any part of the body may be

affected. Causes can be varied: genetics, emotional stress, an autoimmune disease such as psoriasis, thyroid disease, or vitiligo, as well as food and environmental allergies. In my practice, we've recently seen bouts of alopecia areata occur after COVID infections and mRNA vaccinations.

AA affects women more than men, including all racial and ethnic groups. Most people with the disease are healthy with no other symptoms. In most cases, the hair eventually regrows, but there may be subsequent episodes of hair loss. There's no cure for AA, but we do have treatments that help hair grow back more quickly and be less likely to recur.

ALOPECIA TOTALIS (AT)

Alopecia Totalis, an advanced form of alopecia areata, is characterized by the complete loss of hair on the scalp and head—including eyebrows and eyelashes. Its exact cause is unknown, but as with AA, researchers believe that the immune system mistakenly identifies hair follicles as a threat and attacks them.

It's more common in people with autoimmune conditions, such as an overactive thyroid or diabetes. Men and women are affected in equal numbers. Roughly 20% of affected people have a family member with AT, suggesting that genetic factors may contribute to its development.

ALOPECIA UNIVERSALIS (AU)

This rare genetic condition is another even more advanced form of alopecia areata in which the immune system attacks hair follicles across the entire body. A person with AU loses all their hair, including eyebrows and eyelashes, facial hair, body hair, and hair on the head. This hair loss can be permanent or temporary.

TRACTION ALOPECIA (TA)

Traction alopecia is caused by regularly pulling your hair too tightly. Constant tension or "traction" that pulls on the hair shaft over time can weaken and eventually permanently damage the follicle. African American women are specifically at

risk due to hairstyling habits that begin at a young age, though it can affect people of all races and ethnicities. Typical examples include wearing a very tight ponytail or bun, tight braids, cornrows, or dreadlocks, as well as the use of hair extensions, glued-on hairpieces, and weaves.

CICATRICIAL ALOPECIA (CA)

Cicatricial alopecia, also known as scarring alopecia, can be caused by inflammation or another traumatic or surgical injury to the skin. In the case of a surgical scar, the skin heals but does not recreate hair follicles in that area. Inflammatory conditions of the scalp can destroy hair follicles permanently if not treated early, replacing follicles with scars. It's thought that inflammation destroys the stem cells and oil glands of the follicles, resulting in a gradual development of round bare patches on the scalp that expand with time.

ANDROGENETIC ALOPECIA (AGA)

Androgenetic alopecia is the most common form of hair loss. Though it's often referred to as male pattern baldness, hereditary androgenetic alopecia affects both men and women. In men, the hairline recedes, and the crown progressively thins, leading to total hair loss in a very specific pattern, sparing the sides and back of the scalp. In women with hereditary hair loss, the hair in the frontal area typically becomes diffusely thinner, and the temples can recede. AGA is caused by a mixture of genetic and hormonal factors and can start as early as puberty.

TELOGEN EFFLUVIUM (TE)

Telogen effluvium results from a sudden and temporary diffuse hair loss due to excessive shedding of resting or telogen hairs. This abrupt shedding can be triggered by severe illnesses like COVID, a restrictive diet, rapid weight loss, psychological or physiological stress, childbirth, or other traumatic events. If the shedding phase and hair

loss continue for more than six months, it's considered chronic telogen effluvium (CTE.) Keep in mind that you may have more than one type of hair loss occurring at the same time – for example, Androgenetic Alopecia along with Telogen Effluvium.

WHAT CAN BE DONE ABOUT ALOPECIA?

At Bauman Medical, we have numerous ways to help patients who are noticing hair thinning, shedding, or loss of coverage. Effective treatment starts with an accurate diagnosis, and we say "Time is Follicles" because the earlier the treatments are started, the better results you'll experience. Here are a few of our advanced tools and treatment options:

OLUMINANT/BARICITINIB

The newest option for AA alopecia areata is an FDA-approved drug called Oluminant (baricitinib). Oluminant was approved after being shown to result in enough hair growth to be deemed "adequate scalp coverage" in between 17 percent and 32 percent of patients (depending on dosage) taking part in two double-blind, randomized, placebo-controlled clinical trials. Some of the regrowth seen in the clinical trials were downright dramatic. When appropriate, I'm prescribing this, but cautiously, as side effects from these types of immune modulators can involve serious heart-related events, cancer, blood clots and death.

PRP (PLATELET-RICH PLASMA)
