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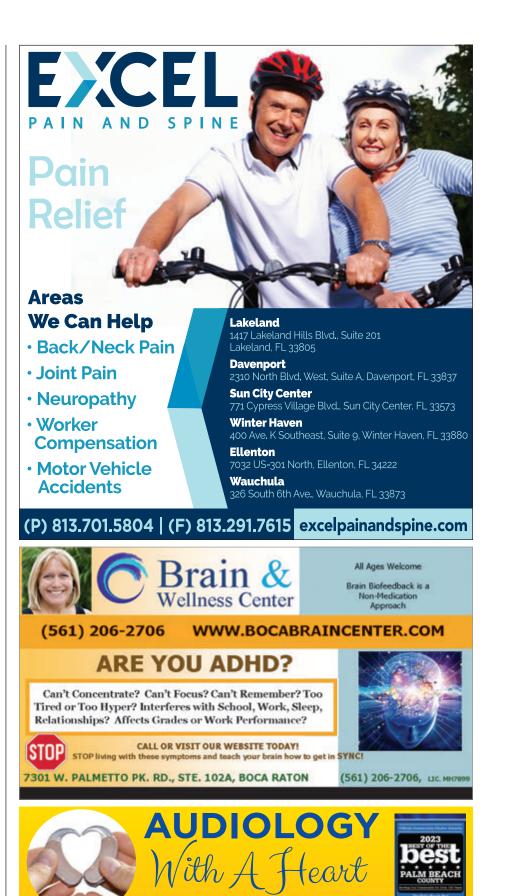
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BayCare Partners with Colleges in Polk County

ursing shortages are at an all-time high across the country. In Polk County, a region that has seen some of the fastest growth in Florida, BayCare hospitals – Bartow Regional Medical Center, Winter Haven Hospital and Winter Haven Women's Hospital – have strengthened their partnerships with local institutions of higher learning.

"It's been exciting to meet these aspiring health care professionals and give them the opportunity to learn about providing excellent patient care from our extraordinary team," said Kristen Smith, the chief nursing officer of BayCare hospitals in Polk County. Students from many local colleges have been able to obtain hands-on training at BayCare hospitals in continuing longtime partnerships. In addition, two new programs have been launched: an externship at Polk State College and a fellows program at Florida Southern College. The Polk State College Faculty Externship is a program developed specifically for the college's nursing faculty. In this program, the extern can become immersed in BayCare's system and expand their professional competencies. The externs can experience challenges that nurses face daily and then better prepare their students for the nursing world. "This is something that textbooks cannot always capture and demonstrate," Smith said. A unique schedule is developed for each participant, based on their learning objectives. Each person can design the length of the shift worked and complete up to 80 hours of clinical activities.

The funding for the externship comes from Winter Haven Hospital and the Department of Education's Linking Industry to Nursing Education (LINE) Funding Grant. The Florida Southern College (FSC) Fellows Program awards up to six FSC recipients a \$30,000 scholarship for their senior year of nursing school. Each fellow is provided employment at Winter Haven Hospital as a nurse apprentice, a role exclusively for student nurses that offers flexible schedules to accommodate class and clinical dates as well as time to do homework and study for exams. Each fellow is hired to work on the patient care unit where they will ultimately work as a nurse, upon graduation and licensure. The employment provides paid hours in the clinical environment, enabling them to practice and perfect basic skills they have learned in school, such as taking vital signs and assisting with patient care. These clinical hours also provide added opportunities for students to learn how to effectively interact with patients, families, coworkers and providers. Funding for the scholarships associated with the fellows program comes from Winter Haven Hospital's Foundation, as well as the LINE grant. Since the program was announced last month, three fellows from FSC have started with BayCare, Smith said. BayCare partners with multiple academic programs and many of their students obtain hands-on training at its hospitals. Student clinical

experiences range from "shadowing" (observing) hospital staff to performing patient care and nursing skills such as taking vitals, assisting with activities of daily living and administering medications under the guidance of program instructors and/or hospital nurses. All students are encouraged to practice and build effective communication skills during their many patient interactions.

Corie Cross is a faculty member at Florida Southern College and precepts two groups of nursing students at Bartow Regional Medical Center twice a week.

"These students have already shown a passion for the nursing profession, and this is how they get that handson experience to understand what they're going into," said Cross. "BayCare has been an incredible partner and the students are getting a unique perspective working in a hospital with a varied patient population and medical diagnoses."

The state Department of Education's LINE grant also helps support six \$15,000 scholarships for senior FSC students. Those who are awarded the scholarship will be eligible to work at any Polk County hospital, including the three BayCare facilities.

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Students from Florida Southern College learn about nursing and patient care twice a week at Bartow Regional Medical Center, where they shadow hospital staff and assist patients under the guidance of program instructors.

BayCare is also continuing its collaboration with Polk State College's College of Nursing through Partnership for Success, Version 2 (Pv2). This program, which relaunched in 2019, reserves up to 16 nursing slots per year in the school's program for BayCare team members who want to pursue a career in nursing in Polk County. Any team member can apply who meets the admission requirements in accordance with Polk State College and BayCare. May and August application periods are open for this program.

In 2022, 974 nursing students across all levels gained clinical experience at BayCare's Polk hospitals. In that time, they gained 42,471 hours of experience towards their future careers.

Polk State College is also a beneficiary of the LINE Funding Grant. Both Winter Haven Hospital and Bartow Regional Medical Center Hospital are providing match dollars to support the purchase of equipment for the PSC Center for Human Simulation, a program that allows students exposure to real-life clinical scenarios. Winter Haven Hospital has committed \$10,000 and Bartow Regional Medical Center has pledged \$5,000 to PSC.

In addition, students at Keiser University, Southeastern University and Traviss Technical College have obtained clinical hours towards their degrees, and a similar partnership for Licensed Practical Nurse students with Traviss and Ridge technical colleges is in the works.

EVERYTHING YOU WANTED TO KNOW ABOUT EARWAX (but were afraid to ask)

hy do we produce earwax? Why do some people develop more than others? Why? Let's try to answer some questions.

What is earwax?

Earwax, known medically as cerumen, is a naturally occurring sticky substance made up of oil and sweat, mixed with dirt and dead skin cells.

Earwax is natural and helpful

- Earwax is a natural barrier that prevents dirt and bacteria from entering the deeper end of the ear canal. Because it is sticky, it is able to collect microscopic debris that can cause infections.
- Earwax acts a moisturizer and protective coating of the ear canal. Without wax, your ear canal can become irritated and itchy, which can lead to an outer ear infection.
- Surprisingly, earwax acts as an insect repellent. The smell of earwax keeps bugs out of your ears. The stickiness or earwax traps any bugs that might have a bad sense of smell.

Why cleaning your ear canals daily lis not necessary

Contrary to popular belief, we do not need to clean our ears with cotton swabs. Keep cotton swabs, paper clips, fingers etc out of your ears. An ear that is too clean is susceptible to infections and to wax impactions.

However, hearing aid users do need to clean their ears periodically. Earwax is the most common reason why a hearing aid will stop working. Please consult with your hearing care professional for advice on your particular needs.

What to do if you have impacted wax?

- Buy an over-the-counter ear cleaning kit from the pharmacy; however, if you are prone to ear infections or you have PE tubes, see your physician before trying any over-the-counter products.
- Do not use cotton swabs (Q-tips), paperclip or any other device you have lying around. This only pushes the wax further down into the ear canal which can impact on the eardrum or worse, puncture the eardrum.
- Do not try ear candling. Besides not being effective, people have experienced burning from the candle, furthering of the impaction, and puncturing of the eardrum.
- If you are not sure what to do, see your Physician or Audiologist for a professional cleaning. Your hearing care professional can look in your ears to determine if the wax needs to be removed or if it is not an issue.

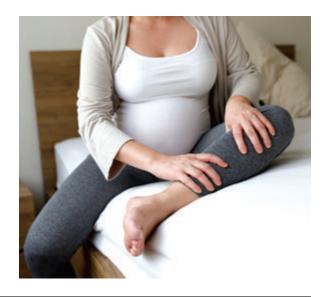

WHY DOES PREGNANCY CAUSE VEIN PROBLEMS?

Pregnancy causes significant changes in your body, and these can adversely affect your legs. The fluid in your body increases by as much as 50% during early pregnancy, and you retain more sodium from the salt you eat. These two factors can cause edema resulting in swollen legs and ankles. Levels of hormones like relaxin, estrogen, and progesterone change dramatically during pregnancy, causing your veins to dilate and weakening the vein walls. At the same time, your growing baby is compressing the veins in your pelvis, increasing pressure in the veins of your legs, and resisting the outflow of blood from the legs.



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These factors make pregnancy a tough time for your legs. Although the causes of vein problems reduce after you give birth, the effects of pregnancy can leave you with lasting issues.

WHAT POST-PREGNANCY VEIN PROBLEMS MIGHT I HAVE?

Common post-pregnancy vein problems are:

Varicose veins

Varicose veins develop because of the pressure and dilation of your veins and resistance to the outflow of blood from your legs. The result can be spider veins with underlying varicose veins even if they aren't visible. Most often there are visible rope-like, bulging varicose veins which may be tender or itchy.

Vulvar varicosities

Vulvar varicosities are varicose veins that affect your vulva. There are rare during pregnancy, and usually disappear over the months following delivery. If you have vulvar varicosities that don't clear up, Vascular Vein Centers provides effective treatments. Pregnancy and post-pregnancy for up to 3 months is a time when you are at greater risk of developing deep vein thrombosis (DVT). DVT risk is higher during pregnancy and peaks after giving birth. Your body is dealing with high hormone and fluid levels and an enlarged uterus, as well as a more sedentary lifestyle.

HOW ARE POST-PREGNANCY VEIN CONDITIONS TREATED?

If you have vein problems after giving birth or persisting swelling, it's advisable to seek an evaluation at Vascular Vein Centers. Hormonal changes continue to affect your veins and fluid volume for some months after having your baby and when you're breastfeeding. This is a good time to wear compression and begin exercising. You might find that once the hormones and fluid volume return to normal, the problem veins get smaller, but they don't go away and will become worse with time. Vascular Vein Centers provides advanced treatments for varicose veins, spider veins and vulvar varicosities, including:

- Foam sclerotherapy using Varithena[®]; an FDA approved treatment
- Endovenous laser therapy (EVLT)
- Ultrasound-guided sclerotherapy
- Cosmetic sclerotherapy for spider veins

These treatments seal off and eliminate affected veins, so your body directs your blood through healthy veins. The treated veins disappear over time. The procedures are all minimally invasive outpatient procedures that the Vascular Vein Centers team performs in-office. RADIOFREQUENCY ABLATION FOR PAIN MANAGEMENT

What is radiofrequency ablation?

Radiofrequency ablation is a treatment that uses electromagnetic waves to create heat. The heat destroys the nerve tissue that's causing your pain. With the nerve destroyed, the pain signal is no longer sent.

What conditions are treated by radiofrequency ablation?

Excel Pain and Spine uses radiofrequency ablation to help patients with chronic pain in the lower back, neck, and sacroiliac joints, which are located in the pelvis. Patients with joint pain related to arthritis may also benefit.

It's also possible to treat other pain conditions with radiofrequency ablation. The team at Spine & Pain Institute of Florida will give you a thorough evaluation to determine the best course of treatment for your symptoms.

How does radiofrequency ablation work?

Radiofrequency ablation is minimally invasive, and the procedure typically takes less than an hour. It's performed on an outpatient basis, and patients are usually allowed to go home after a short recovery period.

Typically, you are given a local anesthetic at the treatment site. Then, using a special X-ray, Dr. Jassal inserts a needle near the nerve that's causing your pain.

Once the needle is in place, a radiofrequency current is passed through the needle to create a precise burn on the nerve. This destroys the part of the nerve responsible for transmitting pain and disrupts the signal to the brain.

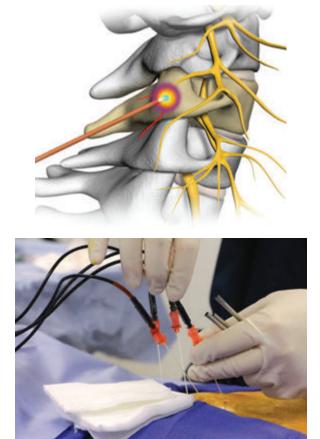
Excel Pain and Spine will provide you with specific postprocedure instructions, and these usually include avoiding driving for 24 hours as well as resting and avoiding strenuous activity for 24 hours.

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Is radiofrequency ablation effective?

Yes. More than 70% of patients experience lasting relief with radiofrequency ablation. It usually takes 1-3 weeks for the treatment to take its full effect.

Pain relief typically lasts 6 months to 2 years, and for some patients, the pain never returns. It's possible, however, for the nerve to regrow. In these cases, radiofrequency ablation may be required again.



Are there any risks associated with radiofrequency ablation?

Radiofrequency ablation is a safe procedure with few risks of complications. Serious complications, such as infection and bleeding, are rare. Temporary side effects – which are also uncommon – usually only last 2-3 days.

They include:

- Localized numbress or weakness
- Mild discomfort or an increase in pain
- Swelling or bruising at the incision site

The treatment is not a good option for women who are or may become pregnant, people with an infection, or those who suffer from bleeding disorders.

Hair Transplantation

The good news is that transplant procedures have become more effective, comfortable, and are 100% natural-looking due to major innovations in techniques and technology.

FUE (follicular unit extraction) is one of Bauman Medical's most

popular hair restoration technologies. Using a variety of techniques that we helped pioneer over a decade ago, we employ several types of FUE, depending on each patient's particular need or situation.

Using robotics, or with the aid of mechanical instruments, we harvest hair follicles directly from the scalp, replacing the older, invasive method of "strip harvesting."
